

At Field Farm

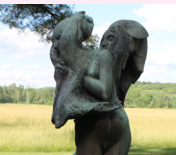

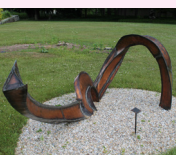

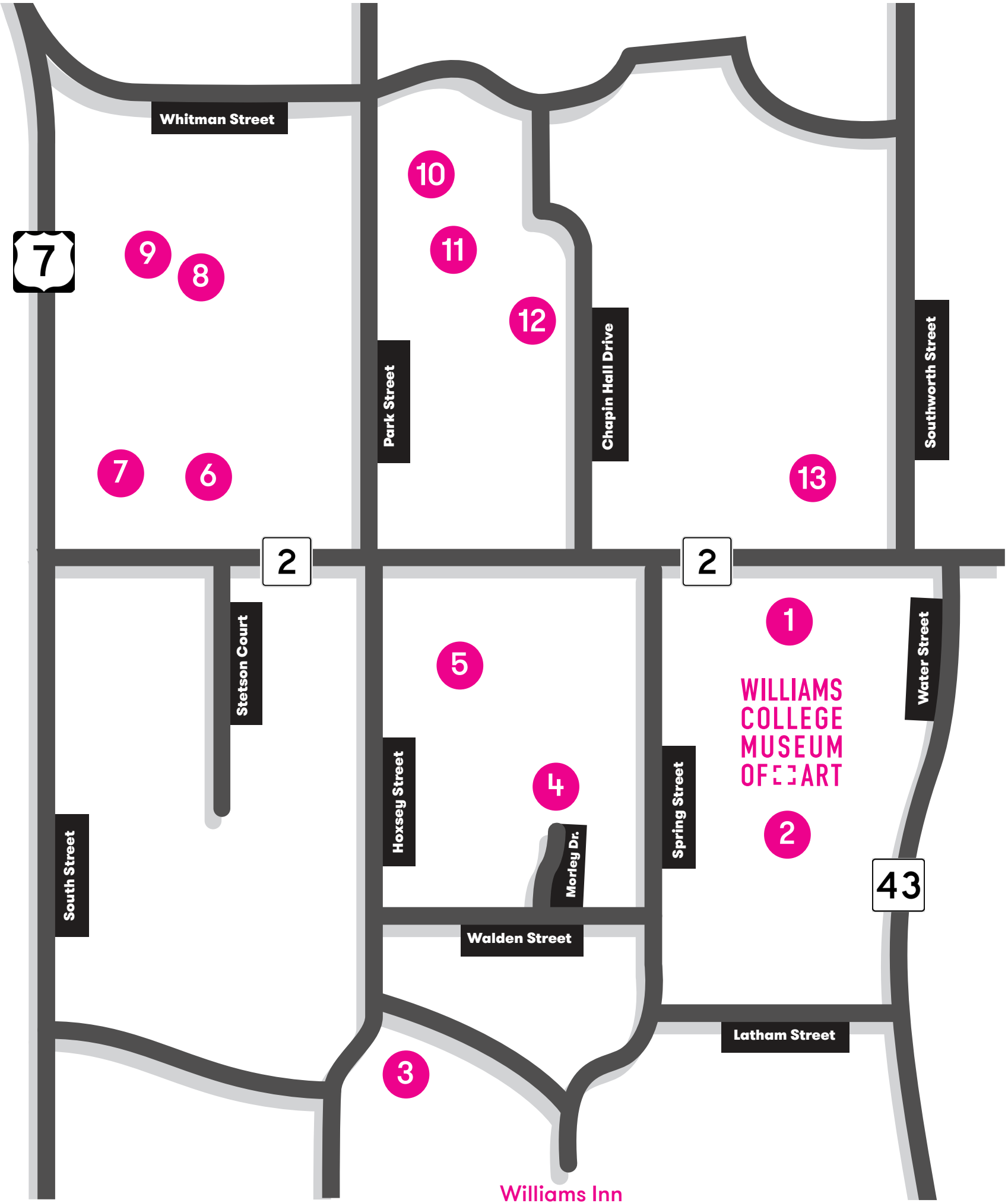

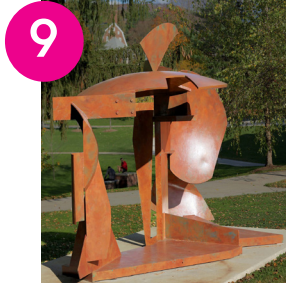
